It strives to bring Africa and USA closer together through the strengthening of economic cooperation and the promotion of sustainable development, with both continents living side by side in peace, security, democracy, prosperity, solidarity and human dignity. In this set up, both sides are determined to overcome the traditional donor-recipient relationship, and to develop a shared long-term vision for US-Africa relations in a globalized world, where they have many common interests on issues such as climate change, business, global security and development.

The 2015 US-Africa Cultural Expo and Business Matchmaking doors open will open in less than 3 months, many prominent figures from US and Africa have already confirmed their participation in the high-level meetings and discussions that will be held at the.
